RED MAPLE

Acer rubrum!

FAMILY: Aceraceae

IDENTIFICATION CLUES





SIZE: large tree, 60 - 90 feet tall feet



LEAF: leaves are light green above and silvery below (yellow, orange or red in fall) with 3 - 5 lobes, a toothed edge and red petiole; deciduous



FLOWER: small red flowers in clusters; appear in the spring before the leaves



FRUIT: fruit is a winged seed (samara) about 1 inch long and red; usually occur as a pair at the end of a long stem



BARK: light gray and smooth on young trees; scaly on older trees



Where to Look

Red maple is common and abundant throughout the state of Georgia. It occurs in deciduous forests of hills and valleys, bottomland forests along rivers and streams.

Importance to Humans

It grows fast and adapts well to many sites making it a popular shade tree for parks and yards. It also has beautiful fall color and few pests. Sometimes, it is used for maple syrup.

Importance to Wildlife

Elk and deer browse young stems of Red Maple.
